



And that's why each year in honor of St. Patrick we all become Irish for the day and go paradin' around yellin' things like 'Erin go braght'. If the afticionados of other saints want to go marchin', too, why, welcome, lads. The Irish have a sayin': "There's always room for one more."

#### Take a stand

An Indiana legislative committee studying criminal law is mistaken, we believe, in voting against formal discussions on repeal of the death penalty.

We appreciate the reason given by Senator Patrick E. Chavez Jr. (D., Indianapolis) for tabling discussion of a repealer. Although he favors repeal, he said the issue had been discussed at great length in the 1985 General Assembly. He believes the committee can use its time to better advantage on other matters.

Indeed, the death penalty was the most widely and heateful debated issue to come before, the Assembly last year. After a long struggle, repeal finally was voted, only to be vetoed by Governor Roger D. Branigan.

At that time Governor Branigan urged that the con-troversial measure be made a campaign issue in the 1966 election so that the popular will could be measured.

Up to now, however, there has been little evidence that abolishment of capital punishment actually will become a major campaign issue. In fact, we have wondered all along whether a single issue like this can be sufficiently isolated in a multi-issue election to be measured by a popular vote.

Be that as it may, it certainly won't be put to any sort of test if it isn't talked about more than it has been to date. If the legislative committee studying criminal law were to project a discussion, that would help force candidates to take a stand pro or con.

Capital punishment is an intolerable abomination. But silence will not rid Indiana of it. It ought to be a key issue in the coming primary.

#### **Worth every lira**

Americans, however scant their personal finances, are used to yast sums of money. It comes from reading about administration budgets, congressional boon-doggles, General Motors profits, and movie star solaries.

Not so the Italians. Silvano Stracca, an Italian journalist, in a report last week from Vatican City, could hardly suppress his astonishment that the four sessions of Vatican II had cost more than \$7 million. A cost, incidentally, defrayed by contributions from Catholics throughout the world.

Stracca's "astonishing figures" concerning such expenses as technical equipment for St. Peter's, transportation and lodging for needy bishops, and international telephone calls were culled from a special issue of the Vatican City weekly, the Sunday Observer. The issue was a comprehensive report of statistical and documentary information on the council.

Unlike Stracca, Americans are likely to be amazed at the ST million bill because it is such a small one. For four years, the council consumed the attention and hopes of Catholics everywhere, instructed the world on the true nature of the Church, melted the barriers of centuries, and shaped the promise of a better world.




