

Whither Vietnam?

In the March 18 issue of The Criterion we ques-tioned whether South Victnam offers any real hope of becoming a durable bastion of freedom, which is the stated major American war aim.

Would not a permanent American overiordship, preceded by a total military victory at incalculable cost, be necessary to effect any lasting reform? Indeed, can we ever accomplish in that bloodly mysterious encorrupt little land what our leaders have said we must, even at the price of a "20-year war?"

These questions, and others we have asked in the past, invariably bring intelligent letters from readers strongly disagreeing with us. We are honored to receive them and pleased to publish them.

We are disappointed, however, in abusive, often foul-spoken letters and telephone calls accusing us of being pro-Communist or worse, or of somehow undermining America's brave sons on the field of combat.

An increasing number of Americans, including many who are in general agreement with United States military decisions, are asking whether we ever can accomplish in Vietnam what our leaders say we must.

These doubts have multiplied as a consequence of the Buddhist uprisings and the growing anti-American-ism sweeping Vietnam.

Poter Lisagor, veteran Vietnam war correspondent of the Chicago Daily News currently in Washington, wrote last Saturday in a column published in the Indianapolis News.

"One of the more abiding mysteries is why otherwise knowledgeable officials in the White House and the State Department talk about 'free elections,' civilian rule,' 'constitutional government,' and other wholly Western concepts in the midst of a savage war, as if those goals were in sight. Vietnam is not a nation but a potpourri of religious, ethnic and cultural bloes."

Lisagor is not notably a critic of the war effort. He is an authority on the Buddhist capacity for Byzantine political skulduggery, just as he is on the unifitness of the Diems, the Kys and all the other princes of misrule in poor Vietnam. And he knows as well as any man that the Communists very likely have a hand in the turnoil in South Vietnam.

Nonetheless, he asks the questions we also have asked.

John S. Knight, the eminent, conservative and anti-Communist editor of the Knight newspaper chain; who has warned consistently since 1954 against American involvement in Vietnam, wrote in last Sunday's Indianapolis Star:

"The crucial decisions which must be made present no easy choice. They defy the simplistic theories of those who urge that we 'win or get out.' They can no longer be based upon the myth that South Vietnam is a united little nation fighting gallantiy against a foreign integer.

"The United States faces the choice between equally unsatisfactory alternatives, and all because of an insane addiction to the belief that we must turn back Communism wherever it exists.

"The blood of our youth which has consecrated many a battlefield, is being spilled in the jungles of Vietnam for causes which are uncertain and in pursuit of unattainable objectives."




